

The Bachelor of Arts in Architecture (BAA) program has three concentrations:

Pre-Professional Architecture Concentration


The Pre-Professional Architecture Concentration prepares students for a two-year professionally accredited Master of Architecture (MArch) degree. This is the concentration for those who know they want to become a licensed architect.

Design Studies Concentration

The Design Studies Concentration is a more flexible path, and allows students to select many of their courses starting in the third year. It can help prepare graduates for a career or a graduate degree in a related discipline, such as digital media, fabrication, landscape architecture, interior design, real estate development, industrial design, animation, urban design, construction management, etc.

Landscape Architecture Concentration

Similar to the Design Studies concentration, this concentration allows students to participate in courses within our Master of Landscape Architecture degree, preparing them for advanced standing in a professionally accredited Master of Landscape Architecture degree, at UNM or elsewhere.




