Assistant Professor of Architecture (two positions)**

The Architecture Program at the University of New Mexico School of Architecture & Planning seeks applicants for two full-time Assistant Professor positions. Both positions are full-time probationary appointments leading to tenure decisions. Applications received on or before January 10, 2012 will have best consideration. The positions will remain open until filled. The appointment commences August 2012.

Position One: Full-time Assistant Professor, probationary appointment leading to tenure decision. The successful candidate will teach design studios and other courses in the area of architectural design with an emphasis on emerging building/construction technologies, digital fabrication, building systems integration, building information modeling, and integrated project delivery.

Position Two: Full-time, Assistant Professor, probationary appointment leading to tenure decision. The successful candidate will teach design studios and other courses in the area of architectural design with an emphasis in research methodologies, architectural theory, analysis and synthesis, and in general, salient design processes as they pertain to critical thinking.

Applicants for both positions are expected to be fully conversant in digital operations, possess a highly developed set of graphic skills and must be capable of teaching either undergraduate or graduate level studios, lecture courses, and/or seminars. In addition, both positions may require the coordination of one of the 6 studio levels within the core curriculum. The ability to oversee and implement studio programs and projects as well as direct part time and/or regular full-time faculty within that studio level is essential. New course development that contributes to the School's curriculum along with a strong personal research agenda in the areas of the candidates' interests is considered vital to attaining tenure. Additional responsibilities include participating in University and School committees, advising, and service to the wider community. In both positions, we seek candidates that have a demonstrated interest in architectural issues as they apply to changing global conditions in realms of critical inquiry regarding climate, society, economy, and technology and also have a strong record of design teaching and demonstrated potential for establishing a significant research and/or practice agenda. The successful candidates are expected to maintain a strong record of achievement through peer-recognized academic and/or professional realms, e.g. publications, awards, and research grants.

Minimum Qualifications for both positions: 1) Master of Architecture degree (or equivalent first professional degree plus post-graduate Master's or PhD degree in related areas); 2) minimum of one year full-time teaching or equivalent in an accredited professional architecture degree program as faculty or visiting faculty; 3) one year full-time experience in an active design practice.

Preferred Qualifications for both positions: 1) evidence of excellence in design and teaching; 2) peer-recognized achievements in academic and/or professional realms; 3) professional licensure; 4) demonstrated ability in the area of specialization; 5) potential to develop a funded research agenda.
