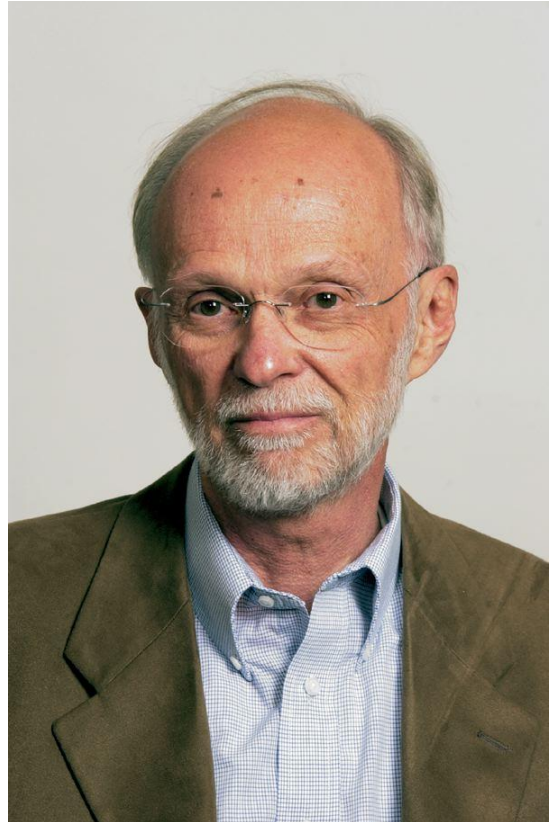

Architect and an emeritus professor of the University of Notre Dame where he taught architecture and urbanism and was Director of Graduate Studies for the School of Architecture. His principle publications include *Nature and the Idea of a Man-made World* (MIT Press, 1994) and *Visual Notes For Architects and Designers* (with Paul Laseau, Wiley and Sons, 1984). His published articles and principle areas of research focus on sustainability and passive energy design in architecture and urbanism.

Professor Crowe holds degrees from Cornell University and the University of Oregon. His professional experience has involved a number of on-site urban design and preservation projects, with locations that include Sidon, Lebanon and Viseu, Portugal as well as South Bend, Indiana, Albion, Michigan, and Chicago, Illinois. He has taught courses in architectural design, urban design, and sustainable design in architecture and urbanism. Professor Crowe's Notre Dame University course "Nature and the Built Environment" is published in the MIT on-line project series "OpenCourseWare."



Professor Crowe was named Plym Distinguished Professor in Architecture at the University of Illinois for 2003-4, and he received The Kanab Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Education from the University of Notre Dame in 2000.
