Harjo researches critical ethnic studies, and community participatory methods for the engagement, empowerment, and emancipation of marginalized rural and urban communities. She was a research fellow with the Advancement Project in Washington DC., where she researched civil rights issues in Florida, Texas, and New Orleans related to voter protection, inclusive development, and the prison industrial complex. Harjo was previously appointed Muscogee (Creek) Nation's Ambassador to the United Nations and is active with the Southern California Native Feminist Reading Group and works with other scholars to imagine new forms of sovereignty and liberation.
