The Architecture Program in the School of Architecture and Planning at the University of New Mexico invites applications for a full-time Visiting Assistant Professor of Architectural History. This one-year non-tenure track appointment will begin Fall 2013 and may be renewable up to three years. The position entails teaching the following required courses: a two-semester course of World Architecture and a one-semester course on modern and contemporary architecture as well as other required and elective courses at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Applications received on or before March 1, 2013 will have best consideration. The position will remain open until filled.

The School of Architecture and Planning is one of nine schools/colleges of the University of New Mexico. There are approximately 350 students in the School comprising 150 undergraduate students in the Bachelor of Arts in Architecture and Bachelor of Arts in Environmental Planning & Design degree programs, and approximately 200 graduate students enrolled in the Architecture, Planning, and Landscape Architecture professionally accredited degree programs.

Minimum requirements include one of the following: ABD status in architectural history; OR Doctor of Design; OR Master of Architecture; OR Master of Architectural History.

Preferred qualifications include: 1) Ph.D. in architectural history; 2) one year of teaching architectural history at the university level; 3) evidence of research and publications.
