CONTEST RULES

This contest is open to ALL STUDENTS of the UNM School of Architecture and Planning, any discipline, graduate or undergraduate level. ONE entry per student.

IMAGE RULES

Any style of image will be accepted, but it must be only an image **without** the name “**RESOURCE CENTER FOR RAZA PLANNING**” or the initials “**RCRP**”. Beyond that, your image can either build off or update the original image as shown on the flyer, or it can also be a totally new image.

Maximum dimension: **10”** (For example, if your image is a square, it will need to be 10” x 10”. If it is taller than it is wider, the vertical dimension will need to be 10”)

Resolution: **300dpi**

File format: **TIF**

File name: **imagecontest_lastname_firstinitial** (logo_chavez_e, for example)

Submit your entry to rcrp@unm.edu by 5pm, August 2, 2013.

Subject line: **Image Contest Submission**

E-mail content: **Full name, Program of study, grad or undergrad, phone number and e-mail contact. AND DON'T FORGET TO ATTACH YOUR FILE!**

After submitting your entry, you will receive an e-mail in 1-3 days with a random code assigned to you. Our panelists will receive only this code with no identifying information regarding who the contest entrants are. Submissions received after the deadline will not be considered.

PRIZE RULES

The contest winner will be notified by e-mail and/or phone on August 12, 2013. After the winner has been contacted, the contest results will be posted on the SAAP website. The UNM Bookstore credit prize can be used towards textbooks and/or any class related materials. The credit will be transferred to the winner by August 14, 2013.
